The Bible tells us that there are three enemies that are warring against us: Firstly, the world, not the world as in people but the world as in the system of ideas and values that are organising active hostility and rebellion against the things of God. Secondly the flesh, as in the nature that is inclined towards disobeying God and thirdly the devil. The devil seeks to destroy God's purposes in your life and wants to tempt you, to deceive you, accuse you and wants to ruin your life. However, the blood of Jesus, the blood he shed on the cross when he died to take away your sins, that blood ultimately gives us victory over Satan.

3) There is real power in prayer. Your prayers are more powerful than you will ever know. Although, we are involved in this invisible war, we do not fight for victory, we fight from victory. The resurrection validates everything that Jesus stood for on the cross and everything that he achieved. Jesus has already won the war. we are now just applying the victory. We are in the clean up operation that will last until Jesus comes again. Satan is already a defeated enemy, his legal authority was rendered null and void by the finished work of Christ on the cross, the resurrection of Jesus from the dead proves it.

Faith Story

God is at work transforming lives even during a worldwide pandemic. Kieran is a young man who has come to faith in Christ during lockdown. A friend at work shared how Jesus had brought change to her life. She spoke of how praying to Jesus gave her the strength to carry on in difficult times. Kieran started watching the online service of the local Elim church and really found it appealing. As he listened, it seemed that the Pastor was talking to Kieran directly which had a powerful impact on him. Kieran started to pray and just took it one step at a time. He got himself a Bible and over a bit of time started to read it.

Since then he has joined an 'Alpha Course' and discovered more about Jesus and Christianity. Kieran shared that originally, he was supposed to start a new job on the 25th of March which he didn't get to start due to lockdown. Although it has been difficult financially, finding Jesus and having God speak to him in a couple of dreams, has had a very profound effect on him. Let this be an encouragement to us all, to share our faith, confident that our God is not locked down.
